

**Student Journaling: Leaf Sketching  
Virtual Sketching Workshop – Drawing from Nature**

Use this worksheet to help you journal and sketch a leaf or another small object from nature. Follow each step and answer the questions as you go.

**1. Look at Your Leaf**

Hold your leaf. Look at its shape, size, and details.

What do you notice about your leaf? (color, shape, edges, spots, holes)

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## 2. Find Shapes

Look at your leaf and find shapes like triangles, circles, rectangles, or squares.

What shapes do you see in your leaf? Write or sketch the shapes you see.

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## 3. Start Your Sketch

Use light pencil lines to sketch your leaf using shapes.

Sketch on a separate page.

## 4. Add Details

Now add leaf details like veins, tips, or any holes or spots.

What special details do you see in your leaf?

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## 5. Shade Your Leaf

Look at where the light hits your leaf. Use your pencil to shade the darker parts.

## 6. Add a Shadow

Look at your leaf's shadow. Draw the shadow under your leaf to show it is sitting on something.

## 7. Final Touches

Sign your name and write the date in the corner of your page.

## 8. Label Your Leaf

Write the name of the kind of leaf you drew (if you know).

Label some parts of your leaf, like the tip, veins, or a hole.
