Drawing with Light and Shadow!

Hello! Let's learn how to make flat shapes look 3D by using light and shading. We'll practice with shapes and draw an apple that looks like it could pop off the page!

Use this worksheet to practice your observation and sketching skills. Follow the prompts below to guide your drawing and shading.

Step 1: Try Grayscale

Use your pencil to show light to dark. Press:

Draw a gravscale bar below (from light to dark):

- Softly for light
- Medium for medium
- Hard for dark

Step 2: Turn Shapes into Forms

Start with these shapes:

- A circle becomes a sphere
- A square becomes a cube

Draw and shade each one to make it look 3D!

1. Circle → **Sphere** (Draw and shade below)

2. Square → **Cube** (Draw and shade below)

Step 3: Add a Light Source

Using the sphere and cube you drew on the last page, place a little sun or light bulb in the top right of your sketch. Use it to help decide where the light hits and where shadows go.

Where is the darkest part of your shape? □ Top □ Bottom □ Side
Where is the lightest part? □ Top □ Bottom □ Side
Extra drawing space in case you want to try the sketches again.

Step 4: Draw Your Apple

Let's draw a simple apple with a bite taken out!

- Start with a circle
- Add a **stem** (use a rectangle or cylinder shape)
- Add a bite (what shapes do you see?)

Draw your apple here:

Now shade it! Use your grayscale skills to:

- Make the top light
- Sides medium
- Bottom dark
- Don't forget the bite and stem!

Add a shadow below the apple too!

I used light, medium, and dark shading

I made shadows to show the apple is sitting on something
